## „Dobry Maharadża” - dr Janusz Wróbel

This is a story of hope and extraordinary hospitality. In the years 1942-48, about 5,000 Polish refugees from Soviet camps, including many children, found shelter in India. One of the places that Polish children reached was Balachadi, where Maharaja Digvijaysinhji, also known as "Jam Saheb", built a settlement for them near his summer palace. His kindness was commemorated in Warsaw with the Good Maharaja Square and the school's patronage on Bednarska Street.

Dr. Janusz Wróbel will tell about this extraordinary story of Polish-Indian relations.

## "India as seen by Poles & Poland as seen by Indians" - Jawahar Jyothi Singh
